

How long does dispute take with Coinbase?(Investigation period)

Disputes involving **unauthorized transactions** or **security concerns** may take more time because Coinbase needs to investigate account activity, verify ownership, and review blockchain transaction records. These cases can sometimes take several weeks, especially if additional documents or identity verification are required from you.

If your dispute involves a **chargeback through your bank or credit card provider**, the timeline may be longer. Bank chargeback investigations can take **30 to 90 days**, as both Coinbase and the bank must review the case. Coinbase has limited control over how quickly banks process these disputes.
