

# What are the 24 rules for Lufthansa?

The “24-hour rule” [+1 855+ 510+ 5815](#) for Lufthansa mainly refers to the airline’s **24-hour check-in and booking flexibility policy**, which is designed to give [+1 855+ 510+ 5815](#) passengers convenience, time to plan, and peace of mind.
